ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP AND VOTING RIGHTS

The Association shall have one class of voting membership defined as follows:
Members shall be all Owners and shall be entitled to one vote for each lot owned. When more than one person holds an interest in any Lot, other than as security for the performance of an obligation, all such persons shall be Members. The vote for such Lot shall be exercised as they, between themselves, determine, by written designation to the Association, but in no event shall more than one vote be cast with respect to any Lot. The vote appurtenant to any Lot shall be suspended in the event that, and for as long as, more than one member holding an interest in that Lot lawfully seeks to exercise it.

ARTICLE IV

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ARTICLE V: ASSOCIATION

Section 2. Delegation of Association Duties. The Association may employ or contract with one or more third parties for the performance of all or any portion of the Association's management, maintenance and repair activities, as the Association Board of Directors may choose. The Association shall be billed by its independent contractors, and the cost therefore shall be included within the General Assessment or Lot Assessment, as the case may be. Any and all such contractors shall be held accountable and answer to the Board of Directors who at all times shall be informed in advance and reserve approval of all actions to be taken on behalf of the Association.

Section 3. Mergers.

a. After the Developer no longer owns any Lots subject to this Declaration, with the written consent of Class A Members holding a majority of the votes, or upon approval of the majority of the votes cast at a meeting at which a majority of members are present in person or by proxy, the Association may merge or consolidate with another not for profit owners association.

b. Upon merger or consolidation of the Association with another Association, the Association's Common Area, rights and obligations may, by operation of law, be transferred to the surviving or consolidated association or alternately, the Common Area, rights and obligations of another property owners association may, by operation of law be added to the Common Area, rights and obligations of the Association, as the surviving corporation pursuant to a merger. To the greatest extent possible, the surviving or consolidated property owners association shall administer the covenants, conditions, easements and restrictions established by this Declaration within the Property, together with any surviving covenants, and restrictions established upon other properties as one scheme, but with such differences in the method a level of Assessments to be levied upon the Property and such other properties as may be appropriate, taking into account the different nature or amount of services to be rendered to the owners thereof by the surviving or consolidated Association. No such merger or consolidation, however, shall affect any revocation, change or addition to the covenants established by this Declaration, except as expressly adopted in accordance with the terms hereof.

ARTICLE VI: COVENANTS FOR MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENTS**Section 6. Default, Remedies and Subordination**

b. All Charges against any Lot pursuant to this Declaration, together with such late fees, interest thereon, and cost of collection thereof (including reasonable attorneys' fees, whether suit is filed or not), shall become a lien on such Lot which lien shall attach upon the recording of the claim of lien as aforesaid. The Association may bring an action at law against the Owner personally obligated to pay the same, foreclose the lien against the Lot, or both. Costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in any such action shall be awarded to the prevailing party. The lien provided for in this Section shall be in favor of the Association. The Association, acting on behalf of the Owners, shall have the power to bid for an interest in any Lot foreclosed at such foreclosure sale and to acquire and hold, lease, mortgage and convey the same. Provided however, unless so provided in a mortgage, the failure to pay Assessments shall not constitute a default under the mortgage. No action may be taken without an authorizing vote by a majority of all directors taken at a duly noticed and publicly held meeting. In addition, the homeowner must be notified of the intention to lien and/or file suit prior to either of these actions, in accordance with Florida Statute 720.3085.

ARTICLE VII: ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

Section 1. Architectural Guidelines. In order to preserve the beauty and aesthetic design of the Development and to promote the value of the Development, the Property is hereby made subject to the following restrictions in this Article VII, and every Lot Owner agrees to be bound hereby. For the purposes of assuring the development of the Property as a residential area of highest quality and standards, and in order that all improvements on each Lot shall present an attractive and pleasing appearance from all sides of view, the Developer reserves the exclusive right and discretion to control and approve the construction of all buildings, structures and other improvements on each Lot in the manner and to the extent set forth herein. No House, other building, fence, wall, driveway, swimming pool or other structure or improvements, regardless of size or purposes, whether attached to or detached from the House shall be commenced, placed, erected or allowed to remain on any Lot nor shall any additions to exterior change or alteration thereto be made, unless and until building plans and specifications covering same, showing the nature, kind, shape, heights, size, materials, floor plans, location and orientation on the Lot, plans for the grading and landscaping of the Lot showing any changes proposed to be made in the elevation or surface contours of the land, approximate square footage, construction schedule and such other information as the Developer shall reasonably require, have been submitted to and approved by the Developer in writing. The Developer shall have the absolute and exclusive right to refuse to approve any such building plans and specifications and lot-grading and landscaping plans that are not, in its opinion, suitable or desirable for any reason, including the purely aesthetic reasons and reasons connected with future development plans of the Developer of the Property and contiguous lands. In passing upon such building plans and specifications and lot-grading and landscaping plans, the Developer may take into consideration the suitability and desirability of proposed construction, the quality of the proposed workmanship, and quality of the materials proposed to be used.

ARTICLE VIII: USE OF PROPERTY

Section 5. Other Structures. The following buildings, structures and objects may be erected and maintained on the Lot only if they are located wholly within the building set back lines and approved by the Developer. Included are pens, yards, houses for pets, tools, and workshops, detached garages, hothouses, greenhouses, bath houses, children's playhouses, outdoor fireplaces, barbecue pits, swimming pools or installation in connection therewith, or any other structure or objects of any unsightly nature or appearance. Construction materials shall be those matching the House. Each such object shall be walled, fenced, or sufficiently landscaped, using materials and with height and design and in such a manner that such objects shall be obstructed from view from the outside of the Lot. No shed, shack, trailer, tent or other temporary or movable structure of any kind shall be erected or permitted to remain on any Lot. This paragraph shall not prevent the temporary, short term placement of any item(s) necessary for a home improvement project, such as building materials, a dumpster or a contractor's trailer for as long as is necessary to complete the home improvement.

Section 11. Aerials, Antennas and Overhead Wires.

All telephone, electrical, and other utility lines and connections between the main utility lines and the House and other buildings located on each Lot shall be concealed and located underground so as not to be visible.

Section 14. Vehicles.

Permitted vehicles are: four wheeled passenger automobiles, vans, SUVs, motorcycles or standard sized pick up trucks not to exceed one ton capacity. Any vehicles in these categories that would, except for business logos or decals, be otherwise allowed, are also permitted.

No maintenance or repair of the type of vehicles permitted hereunder, which necessitates putting the vehicle on blocks or otherwise extends for a period of greater than 3 daylight hours may be performed upon any such vehicle on any lot unless with written permission from the Association, except within the garage, totally isolated from public view.

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DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS, RESTRICTIONS AND EASEMENTS FOR BELLE RIVE UNIT FOUR

THIS DECLARATION, made this 8th day of August, 1994, by DAWSON DEVELOPMENT COMPANY, INC., whose mailing address is 320 East Adams St., Jacksonville, Florida 32202, hereinafter called "Developer" and amended by a two thirds majority of the Owners in attendance in person or by proxy at a duly called meeting of the Association held on October 16, 2008.

RECITALS

A. Developer is the owner of that certain real property located in Duval County, Florida and more particularly described all the lands in BELLE RIVE UNIT FOUR according to plat thereof recorded in Plat Book 49, pages 23, 23A, 23B, and 23C, of the public records of Duval County, Florida (the "Property").

B. It is the intention and desire of Developer to develop the Property as a residential community, with improvements which are developed and maintained as part of a residential development of superior quality, architectural design and condition.

C. Developer further desires to maintain the beauty of the Property; to assure high-quality standards for the enjoyment of the Property; to provide for the preservation, enhancement and maintenance of the Property and the improvements thereon, and in order to do so, Developer desires to subject the Property to the covenants, restrictions, easements, charges and liens of this Declaration, each and all of which is and are for the benefit of the Property and each owner of a portion thereof.

D. In order to provide for the efficient management of the Property, Developer desires to create a not-for-profit association. The Association, as hereinafter defined, shall own, operate, maintain and administer all of the common areas within the Property and administer and enforce the covenants, conditions, restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth. The Association shall also have the power and duty to administer and enforce the easements set forth in this Declaration, and to collect and disburse the assessments hereinafter created.

DECLARATION

NOW, THEREFORE, Developer hereby declares that the Property shall be held, sold and conveyed subject to the following easements, restrictions, covenants, limitations and conditions, which are for the purpose of protecting the value and desirability of, and which shall run with, the Property and be binding upon all parties having any right, title or interest in the Property or any part thereof, their heirs, successors and assigns, and shall inure to the benefit of each Owner thereof, including Developer.

ARTICLE I: DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall apply wherever the capitalized terms appear in this Declaration:

a. "Association" shall mean and refer to BELLE RIVE FOUR Homeowners Association, Inc., a Florida not-for-profit corporation, its successors and assigns. The Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws for the Association shall be referred to as the "Association Articles of Incorporation" and the "Association "Bylaws", respectively.

b. "Association Rules and Regulations" shall mean and refer to the rules, regulations and policies adopted by the Board of Directors as the same may be amended from time to time.

c. "Board of Directors" shall mean and refer to the Board of Directors of the Association.

d. "Charges" shall mean and include all General, Special and Lot Assessments and fines.

e. "Common Area" or "Common Areas" shall mean and refer to all real and personal property now or hereafter owned or required to be maintained by the Association which is intended for the common use and enjoyment of all of the owners within the Property. The Common Areas will include the entryway to the Property, including signage, landscaping, lighting, fencing and irrigation and such other lands which shall be assigned to the Association from time to time, including without limitation responsibility for a portion of the Surface Water Management System which serves the Property.

f. "Developer" shall mean and refer to DAWSON DEVELOPMENT COMPANY, INC., or such other entity which has been specifically assigned the rights of Developer here under and any assignee thereof which has had the rights of Developer similarly assigned to it. The Developer may also be an Owner for so long as the Developer shall be record owner of any Lot as defined herein.

g. "Declaration" shall mean and refer to this Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Easements applicable to the Property.

h. "Family" shall mean and refer to a social unit consisting of parent(s) and the children that they rear.

i. "General Assessment" shall mean and refer to an assessment required of all Owners, as further provided in Article VI entitled "Covenants for Maintenance Assessments" and elsewhere in this Declaration.

j. "Guest" shall mean and refer to a social guest of an Owner. However, any person residing on any portion of the Property for a period of sixty (60) consecutive days or longer shall be deemed a permanent resident.

k. "House" shall mean and refer to any single family residential dwelling constructed or to be constructed on or within any Lot.

l. "Lot" shall mean and refer to any plot of land intended as a site for a House, whether or not the sale is then shown upon any duly recorded subdivision plat of the Property. Upon construction of a House, the term "Lot" as used herein shall include the House and Yard.

m. "Lot Assessment" shall mean and refer to any assessment charged to a particular Owner pursuant to this Declaration for services and costs which relate specifically to that Owner's Lot.

n. "Member" shall mean and refer to those persons entitled to membership in the Association as provided in this Declaration or the Association Articles and Bylaws.

o. "Mortgage" shall mean any bona fide first mortgage encumbering a Lot as security for the performance of an obligation.

p. "Mortgagee" shall mean and refer to any institutional holder of a Mortgage, such as a bank, savings and loan association, insurance company, or any other lender generally recognized as an institutional type lender or any insurer or organization or a mortgage, including, without limitation, the Federal Housing Administration ("FHA") or the Veterans Administration ("VA").

q. "Owner" shall mean and refer to the record owner, whether one or more natural persons or entities, of the fee simple title to any Lot. Owner shall not include those having an interest merely as security for the performance of an obligation,

r. "Plat" shall mean and refer to that certain plate of BELLE RIVE UNIT FOUR, recorded in Plat Book 49 pages 23.23A, 238B and 23C, of the current public records of Duval County, Florida.

s. "Special Assessment" shall mean and refer to those Special Assessments referred to in Article VI hereof.

t. "Surface Water Management System" shall mean a system which is designed, constructed or implemented to control discharges which are necessitated by rainfall events, in or operating methods to collect, convey, store, absorb, inhibit, treat, use or reuse water to prevent or reduce flooding, over drainage, environmental degradation and water pollution or otherwise affect the quality and quantity of discharge from the system as permitted pursuant to Chapter 40C-4, 40C-40 or 40C-42 F.A.C.

u. "Yard" shall mean and refer to any and all portions of any Lot lying outside the exterior walls of any House constructed on such Lot and shall include all landscaping, improvements and decorative and functional' appurtenances thereon.

ARTICLE II: PROPERTY SUBJECT TO THIS DECLARATION

Section 1. Property Included. The real property which is and shall be held, transferred, sold, conveyed and occupied subject to this Declaration consists of that land lying in Duval County, Florida, which has been more particularly described in the Plat of BELLE RIVE UNIT 4 recorded in Plat Book 49, pages 23, 23A, 23B and 23C. of the public records of Duval County, Florida.

Section 2. Resubdivision. No Lot upon which a House has been constructed shall be further subdivided or separated into smaller Lots by any Owner; provided that this provision shall not prohibit corrective deeds, or similar corrective instruments.

Provided further that Developer reserves the right to resubdivide or replat any Lot or Lots shown on the Plat for any purposes whatsoever, including rights-of-way for road purposes and easements, provided that no House shall be erected upon, nor any Owner allowed to occupy a replatted or resubdivided Lot or fractional part or parts thereof, having an area less than the smallest Lot shown on the Plat. These restrictions shall continue to apply to each Lot as replatted or resubdivided except any Lot or Lots resubdivided or replatted for road purposes or easements, if the road or easement is dedicated for a public purpose.

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP AND VOTING RIGHTS

The Association shall have one class of voting membership defined as follows:

Members shall be all Owners and shall be entitled to one vote for each lot owned. When more than one person holds an interest in any Lot, other than as security for the performance of an obligation, all such persons shall be Members. The vote for such Lot shall be exercised as they, between themselves, determine by written designation to the Association, but in no event shall more than one vote be cast with respect to any Lot. The vote appurtenant to any Lot shall be suspended in the event that, and for as long as, more than one member holding an interest in that Lot lawfully seeks to exercise it.

ARTICLE IV:

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ARTICLE V: ASSOCIATION

Section 1. Association Powers and Duties. The duties and powers of the Association shall be those provided for by law or set forth in this Declaration, the Association's Articles and Bylaws, together with those duties and powers which may be reasonably implied to effect the purposes of the Association. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Association may take such measures and perform such services which in the judgment of the Board of Directors are necessary or desirable to enforce the covenants, conditions, restrictions and limitations set forth in this Declaration; operate, maintain and administer all Common Areas within the Property; administer and enforce the easements provided for in this Declaration; and collect and disburse the assessments created in this Declaration. Except in the event of an Owner's Default (see Article VIII, Section 25, the Association is not responsible for any exterior maintenance of Houses, including but not limited to, glass surfaces on doors, screens and screen doors, exterior doors and window fixtures, terraces, patio and deck improvements or roofs.

Section 2. Delegation of Association Duties. The Association may employ or contract with one or more third parties for the performance of all or any portion of the Association's management, maintenance and repair activities, as the Association Board of Directors may choose. The Association shall be billed by its independent contractors, and the cost therefore shall be included within the General Assessment or Lot Assessment, as the case may be. Any and all such contractors shall be held accountable and answer to the Board of Directors who at all times shall be informed in advance and reserve approval of all actions to be taken on behalf of the Association.

Section 3. Mergers.

a. After the Developer no longer owns any Lots subject to this Declaration, with the written consent of Class A Members holding a majority of the votes, or upon approval of the majority of the votes cast at a meeting at which a majority of members are present in person or by proxy, the Association may merge or consolidate with another not for profit owners association.

No such merger or consolidation, however, shall affect any revocation, change or addition to the covenants established by this Declaration, except as expressly adopted in accordance with the terms hereof.

ARTICLE VI: COVENANTS FOR MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENTS

Section 1. Creation of Assessments. All Assessments (referred to collectively in this Article as "Charges"), together with interest and cost of collection when delinquent, shall be a charge on the land and shall be a continuing lien upon the Lot against which the Charges are made, and shall also be the personal obligation of the person or entity who is the Owner of such Lot at the time when the Charges were levied, and of each subsequent Owner. The lien shall attach to the Lot upon recording of a claim of lien in the public records of Duval County, Florida, which lien be a recordable form and be signed by a duly authorized officer of the Association. The claim of lien can provide that it secures not only current outstanding Assessments as of the date of filing the claim of lien, but may also include future unpaid Assessments, interest, late charges, and other costs related thereto. Each Owner of a Lot, by acceptance of a deed or other transfer document therefore, whether or not it shall be so expressed in such deed or transfer document, is deemed to covenant and agree to pay the Association the Charges established or described in this Article and in the Association Articles and Bylaws. No diminution or abatement or any Charges shall be allowed by reason of any alleged failure of the Association to perform such function required of it, or any alleged negligent or wrongful acts of the Association, or its officers, agents and employees, or the nonuse by the Owner of any or all of the Common Areas, the obligation to pay such Charges being a separate and independent covenant by each Owner. Mortgagees are not required to collect Assessments.

Section 2. Annual General Assessment. Each Lot within the Property is subject to an Annual General Assessment made by the Association for the improvement, maintenance and operation of the Property, including the management and administration of the Association and the furnishing of services as set forth in this Declaration. Such General Assessments must be allocated equally on a per lot basis. As further described in this Article, the Board of Directors of the Association by a majority vote shall set the Annual General Assessments at a level sufficient to meet the Association's obligations. The Association Board of Directors shall have the right, power and authority, during any fiscal year, to increase the Annual General Assessment for the purpose of meeting its expenses and operating costs on a current basis. The Association Board of Directors shall set the date or dates that the Assessments shall become due, and may provide for collection of Assessments annually or in monthly, quarterly or semiannual installments; provided, however, that upon a default in the payment of any one or more installments, the entire balance of the yearly Assessment may be accelerated at the option of the Association Board of Directors and be declared due and payable in full.

Section 3. Special Assessment.

a. In addition to Annual General Assessments authorized above, the Association may with 14 day notice of Board consideration of assessment levy in any assessment year a Special Assessment for the purpose of defraying, in whole or in part, the cost of any construction, reconstruction, repair or replacement of a capital improvement upon the Common Areas, including fixtures and personal property related thereto, provided that such Special Assessments shall have been properly authorized pursuant to the terms of the Association Articles and Bylaws.

b. In addition, the Association may levy an Emergency Assessment at any time by a majority vote of the Association Board of Directors, for the purpose of defraying, in whole or in part, the cost of any unusual or emergency matters that affect the Common Areas, and such Emergency Assessment shall be due and payable at the time and in the manner specified by the Association Board of Directors.

Section 4. Lot Assessment. In addition to the Assessments authorized above, the Association may levy in any assessment year a Lot Assessment against a particular Lot for the purpose of defraying, in whole or in part, the cost of any construction, reconstruction, repair or replacement of a capital improvement upon the specific Lot, or any other maintenance or special services provided to such Lot or its Owner, the cost of which is not included in the General Assessment.

Section 5. Commencement of Payment. The initial Annual General Assessment on any Lot subject to assessment shall be collected at the time title to such Lot is conveyed to the Owner by the Developer. During the initial year of ownership, each owner shall be responsible for the pro-rata share of the General or Special Assessments charged to that Owner's Lot, prorated to the date of closing based upon a thirty-day month.

Section 6. Default, Remedies and Subordination.

a. Any Charges not paid within fifteen (15) days after the due date shall be subject to a late fee as determined from time to time by the Association Board of Directors and shall bear interest at a rate of eighteen percent (18%) per annum until paid.

b. All Charges against any Lot pursuant to this Declaration, together with such late fees, interest thereon, and cost of collection thereof (including reasonable attorneys' fees, whether suit is filed or not), shall become a lien on such Lot which lien shall attach upon the recording of the claim of lien as aforesaid. The Association may bring an action at law against the Owner personally obligated to pay the same, foreclose the lien against the Lot, or both. Costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in any such action shall be awarded to the prevailing party. The lien provided for in this Section shall be in favor of the Association. The Association, acting on behalf of the Owners, shall have the power to bid for an interest in any Lot foreclosed at such foreclosure sale and to acquire and hold, lease, mortgage and convey the same. Provided however, unless so provided in a mortgage, the failure to pay Assessments shall not constitute a default under the mortgage. No action may be taken without an authorizing vote by a majority of all directors taken at a duly noticed and publicly held meeting. In addition, the homeowner must be notified of the intention to lien and/or file suit prior to either of these actions, in accordance with Florida Statute 720.3085.

c. Each Owner, by acquisition of an interest in a Lot, hereby expressly vests in the Association the right and power to bring all actions against such Owner personally for the collection of such Charges as a debt and to enforce the aforesaid by all methods available for the enforcement of such liens, including foreclosures, by an action brought in the name of the Association, in a like manner as a mortgage lien on real property, and such Owner hereby expressly grants to the Association a power of sale in connection with such lien. No Owner may waive or otherwise escape liability for the Charges provided for herein by abandonment of his Lot.

d. The lien of the Charges provided for herein shall be inferior and subordinate to the lien of a Mortgage held by a Mortgagee now or hereafter placed upon any Lot subject to assessment so long as such Mortgage lien is recorded prior to any claim of lien filed by the Association. Sale or transfer of any Lot shall not affect the lien; however, the sale or transfer of any Lot pursuant to foreclosure of such Mortgage, including a transfer by a deed in lieu of foreclosure, shall extinguish the lien of such Charges as to payments which became due prior to such sale or transfer.

Section 7. Association Certificate. The Treasurer of the Association, upon demand of any Owner liable for Charges, shall furnish to such Owner a certificate in writing signed by such Treasurer, setting forth whether such Charges have been made.

Section 8. Budget.

a. The fiscal year of the Association shall consist of a twelve-month period commencing on first day of January of each year and terminating on last day of December of that year.

b. Developer shall determine the Association budget for the fiscal year in which a Lot is first assessed its fractional share of the Annual General Assessment.

c. Pursuant to the Association Articles and Bylaws, the Association Board of Directors shall adopt a budget for each succeeding year containing an estimate of the total amount which they consider necessary to pay the cost of all expenses to be incurred by the Association, to carry out its responsibilities and obligations including, without limitation, the cost of wages, materials, insurance premiums, services, supplies and other expenses needed to render the services specified here under. Such budget shall also include such reasonable amounts as the Association Board of Directors consider necessary to provide working capital and to provide for a general operating reserve and reserves for contingencies and replacements. The Association Board of Directors shall send each of its Members a copy of the budget, in a reasonably itemized form which sets forth the amount of the Assessments payable by each of its Members. Each budget shall constitute the basis for determining each Owner's General Assessment as provided herein.

d. The failure or delay of the Association Board of Directors to prepare or adopt the annual budget or adjusted budget for any fiscal year shall not constitute a waiver or release in any manner of any Owner's obligation to pay his Assessment as herein provided, whenever the same shall be determined. In the absence of an annual budget or adjusted budget, each Owner shall continue to pay the Assessment at the then existing rate established for the previous fiscal period in the manner such payment was previously due until notified otherwise.

Section 9. Exempt Property. The following property subject to this Declaration shall be exempted from the Assessments and liens created herein:

a. All properties dedicated to and accepted by a governmental body, agency or authority

b. All Common Areas

c. All properties owned by any charitable or nonprofit organization exempt from taxation under the laws of the State of Florida, except any such property occupied as a House and

d. All properties owned by the Developer; provided further that the Developer may assign this exemption right to any entity which acquires Lots for construction and resale purposes. Such an assignment shall have no effect on the Developer's exemption here under.

Section 10. Payment of Taxes. In the event the Common Areas owned by the Association are taxed separately from the Lots deeded to Owners, the Association shall include such taxes as a part of the budget. In the event the Common Areas owned by the Association are taxed as a component of the value of the Lot owned by each Owner, it shall be the obligation of each Owner to timely pay such taxes.

ARTICLE VII: ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

Section 1. Architectural Guidelines. In order to preserve the beauty and aesthetic design of the Development and to promote the value of the Development, the Property is hereby made subject to the following restrictions in this Article VII, and every Lot Owner agrees to be bound hereby. For the purposes of assuring the development of the Property as a residential area of highest quality and standards, and in order that all improvements on each Lot shall present an attractive and pleasing appearance from all sides of view, the Developer reserves the exclusive right and discretion to control and approve the construction of all buildings, structures and other improvements on each Lot in the manner and to the extent set forth herein. No House, other building, fence, wall, driveway, swimming pool or other structure or improvements, regardless of size or purposes, whether attached to or detached from the House shall be commenced, placed, erected or allowed to remain on any Lot nor shall any additions to exterior change or alteration thereto be made, unless and until building plans and specifications covering same, showing the nature, kind, shape, heights, size, materials, floor plans, location and orientation on the Lot, plans for the grading and landscaping of the Lot showing any changes proposed to be made in the elevation or surface contours of the land, approximate square footage, construction schedule and such other information as the Developer shall reasonably require, have been submitted to and approved by the Developer in writing. The Developer shall have the absolute and exclusive right to refuse to approve any such building plans and specifications and lot-grading and landscaping plans that are not, in its opinion, suitable or desirable for any reason, including the purely aesthetic reasons and reasons connected with future development plans of the Developer of the Property and contiguous lands. In passing upon such building plans and specifications and lot-grading and landscaping plans, the Developer may take into consideration the suitability and desirability of proposed construction, the quality of the proposed workmanship, and quality of the materials proposed to be used.

Section 2. Limitation on Approval. No approval of plans and specifications by the Developer shall be construed as representing or implying that such plans, specifications or standards will, if followed, result in properly designed improvements. Such approvals and standards shall in no event be construed as representing or guaranteeing that any House or other improvement built in accordance therewith will be built in accordance with applicable building codes or other governmental requirements or in a good and workmanlike manner. Upon completion of all Houses on the Lots, the Developer shall assign its rights here under to approve plans and specifications to the Association. Such approvals shall thereafter be subject to the Board of Directors or an architectural review committee established by the Board. Neither the Developer nor the Association shall be responsible or liable for any defects in any plans or specifications submitted, revised or approved pursuant to the terms of this Article, nor any defects in construction undertaken pursuant to such plans and specifications.

ARTICLE VIII: USE OF PROPERTY

In order to preserve the Property as a desirable place to live for all Owners, the following protective covenants are made a part of this Declaration:

Section 1. Single Family Residence Only. Each Lot shall be used for the purpose of constructing a single family residence thereon ("House") and for no other purpose. Except as herein otherwise provided, no structure shall be erected, altered or permitted to remain on any Lot other than one single family House. The single family house shall be designed and constructed in a manner that the gables of any two coterminous units do not face each other in any given circumstance. No building or structure shall be rented or leased separately from the rental or lease of the entire Lot. Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent Developer from using any Lot or portion thereof as a right-of-way for road purposes or for access or utility easement, in which event none of these restrictions shall apply nor from using a Lot as a sales center or model home during the construction of Houses on the Property. No building or structure shall have exposed concrete blocks except for its foundation. No carports shall be constructed without prior approval of the Developer. In no way will the Lots be used for anything involving oil and/or mining operations.

Section 2. Minimum Square Footage. No House or other structure shall be constructed on a Lot which has a height exceeding 35 feet above the elevation of the finished surface of the first floor of such dwelling. All one-story Houses constructed on Lots shall have a minimum of 1200 square feet of heated and air conditioned living space. All two-story Houses constructed on Lots shall have a minimum of 1200 square feet of heated and air conditioned living space.

Section 3. Setback Definitions. In any event, no structure of any kind shall be located on any Lot nearer to the front lot line, nor nearer to any side street line, nor nearer to any side Lot line than that which is permitted by applicable zoning from time to time, as the same may be modified by variance, exception, or other modification. If any one House is erected on more than one Lot, or on a building plot composed of parts of more than one Lot, the side line restrictions set forth above, shall apply only to the extreme side lines of the building plot occupied by such House. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent Developer from reducing the building restriction lines with the prior written approval of the governmental agencies having jurisdiction.

Section 4. Maximum Lot Coverage. The maximum area of a Lot covered by all buildings and structures shall not exceed Duval County Zoning Guidelines, as such are modified from time to time.

Section 5. Other Structures. The following buildings, structures and objects may be erected and maintained on the Lot only if they are located wholly within the building set back lines and approved by the Developer. Included are pens, yards, houses for pets, tools, and workshops, detached garages, hothouses, greenhouses, bath houses, children's playhouses, outdoor fireplaces, barbecue pits, swimming pools or installation in connection therewith, or any other structure or objects of any unsightly nature or appearance. Construction materials shall be those matching the House. Each such object shall be walled, fenced, or sufficiently landscaped, using materials and with height and design and in such a manner that such objects shall be obstructed from view from the outside of the Lot. No shed shack, trailer, tent or other temporary or movable structure of any kind shall be erected or permitted to remain on any Lot. This paragraph shall not prevent the temporary, short term placement of any item(s) necessary for a home improvement project, such as building materials, a dumpster or a contractor's trailer for as long as is necessary to complete the home improvement.

Section 6. Residing Only in House. No trailer, basement, garage, or any outbuilding of any kind other than a guest house or servants' quarters shall be at any time used as residence either temporarily or permanently.

Section 7. Fences. Hedges, fences or walls may not be built or maintained on any portion of any Lot except on the rear or interior side Lot line and not closer to the front of the Lot than the front line of the House; nor closer than twenty feet (20') to a side street when the House is situated on a corner Lot. No fence or wall shall be erected nor hedge maintained higher than six feet (6') from the normal surface of the ground and all fences shall be privacy fences with the finished side facing outside. No chain link fences shall be erected on any Lot. No fence or wall shall be erected until quality, style, color and design shall have been first approved in writing by the Developer.

Section 8. Sewage Disposal and Water Service. The utility company providing service to the Property has the sole and exclusive right to provide all water and sewage facilities and service to the Property. No well of any kind shall be dug or drilled on the Property to provide potable water for use within any structure, and no potable water shall be used within said structures except potable water which is obtained from the utility company. Nothing herein shall prevent the digging of a well to provide water for swimming pools, irrigation of a yard or garden or for heat transfer systems of heating and air conditioning units. No septic tank may be constructed on any Lot. No sewage may be discharged on the open ground or into the marshlands. All sewage must be disposed of through the sewer lines and disposal plant owned and controlled by the utility

company or its assigns. No water from air conditioning systems or swimming pools shall be disposed of through the lines of the storm sewer system. The utility company has a non-exclusive perpetual easement in, over and under the areas described on the Plat as "Easement for Utilities" or similar wording for the purposes of installation, maintenance and operation of water and sewage facilities. Animal waste shall not be disposed of in the surface water drains located at the curbs.

Section 9. Motorists' Vision to Remain Unobstructed.

The Developer shall have the right, but not the obligation, to remove or require the removal of any fence, wall, hedge, shrub, bush, tree or other thing, natural or artificial, placed or located on any Lot, if the location of same will, in the sole judgment and opinion of the Developer, obstruct the vision of the motorist upon any of the streets.

Section 10. Signs. No sign of any character shall be displayed or placed on any Lot except "FOR RENT" or "FOR SALE" signs which shall be no larger than four feet (4') square, or one small sign used to denote the name and address of the resident, which sign may refer only to the particular premises on which displayed, and shall be of materials, size, height, and design approved by the Developer. The Developer may enter upon any Lot and summarily remove any signs which do meet the provisions of this paragraph. Nothing contained in this Declaration shall prevent the Developer or any person designated by the Developer from erecting or maintaining such commercial and display signs as Developer deems appropriate and such temporary dwellings, model houses and other structures as the Developer may deem advisable for development purposes.

Section 11. Aerials, Antennas and Overhead Wires.

All telephone, electrical, and other utility lines and connections between the main utility lines and the House and other buildings located on each Lot shall be concealed and located underground so as not to be visible.

Section 12. Pets. Not more than two dogs, or two cats, or four birds (excluding parrots) or two rabbits, or any combination of two thereof, may be kept on a Lot for the pleasure and use of the occupants, but not for any commercial or breeding use. When in the sole opinion of the Developer, the animal or animals are dangerous or are an annoyance or nuisance or destructive of wildlife, they may not hereafter be kept on the Lot. It shall be the Owners responsibility to report to The Association the housing of any dog with a history of violent or aggressive behavior. Birds and rabbits shall be kept caged at all times. All pets must be held or kept leashed at all times if they are in the Common Areas, and pet owners shall immediately collect and properly dispose of the waste and litter of their pets. The Association reserves the right to limit those parts of the Common Areas where pets may be walked and to make reasonable rules and regulations restricting the number and type of pets that may be kept on any Lot.

Section 13. No Offensive Activities and Conditions. No illegal, noxious or offensive activity shall be permitted on any part of the Property, nor shall anything be permitted or done which is or may become a nuisance or a source of embarrassment, discomfort, or annoyance to the neighborhood. No trash, garbage, rubbish or debris shall be deposited or allowed to accumulate or remain outside a receptacle on any part of the Property or on any contiguous land. No fires for burning trash, leaves, clippings, or other debris shall be permitted on any part of the Property, including street rights-of-way. Landscaping is to be neatly trimmed, weeded and maintained. Lawn grass shall not exceed ten inches (10") in height.

Section 14. Vehicles. Permitted vehicles are: four wheeled passenger automobiles, vans, SUVs, motorcycles or standard sized pickup trucks not to exceed one ton capacity. Any vehicles in these categories that would, except for business logos or decals, be otherwise allowed, are also permitted. No recreational vehicle, i.e. campers, boats with/out trailers, or other vehicles, including, but not limited to, mobile homes, trailers (either with or without wheels), motor homes, tractors, race cars, commercial vehicles of any type, or semitrailers will be allowed to be stored in the subdivision. No maintenance or repair of the type of vehicles permitted here under, which necessitates putting the vehicle on blocks or otherwise extends for a period of greater than 3 daylight hours may be performed upon any such vehicle on any lot unless with written permission from the Association, except within the garage, totally isolated from public view.

Section 15. Air Conditioners. Unless the written approval of the Developer has been obtained, no window air conditioning units shall be installed in any side of a building which faces a street.

Section 16. Clothesline. No clothesline or other clothes drying facility shall be permitted on any Lot, except fully screened from view.

Section 17. Storage of Fuel Tanks Garbage and Trash Receptacles. All above ground tanks, cylinders or containers for the storage of liquefied petroleum, gas or other fuel, garbage or trash, shall be screened from view from adjacent Lots and any street.

Section 18. Insurance. Nothing shall be done or kept on any Lot or in the Common Areas which will increase the rate of insurance for the Property or any other Lot, or the contents thereof, without the prior written consent of the Association. No Owner shall permit anything to be done or kept on his Lot or in the Common Areas which will result in the cancellation of insurance on the Property or any other Lot, or the contents thereof, or which will be in violation of the law.

Section 19. Inspections. Owners shall allow the Board of Directors or the agents and employees of the Developer to enter any Lot for the purpose of inspection, of the improvements within the Yards or, in the case of emergency, for any purpose, or to determine compliance with this Declaration.

Section 20. Surface Water Management System. The Association shall be responsible for the maintenance, operation and repair of the Surface Water Management System. Maintenance of the Surface Water Management System shall mean the exercise of practices which allow the systems to provide drainage, water storage, conveyance or other surface water management capabilities as permitted by the St. Johns River Water Management District. Any repair or reconstruction of the Surface Water Management System shall be as permitted, or if modified, as approved by the St. Johns River Water Management District.

Section 21.
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Section 22. Mail Boxes. Mail box, paper box or other receptacle of any kind for use in the delivery of mail, newspapers, magazines, or other similar material may be erected and located on any Lot. The type of material for said boxes or receptacles shall be compatible and in keeping with the neighborhood and shall be approved by the Developer.

Section 23. Weed Control. The Owner of each Lot, whether improved or not improved, shall keep the Lot free of tall grass, undergrowth, dead trees, dangerous tree limbs, weeds, trash and rubbish, and shall keep the Lot at all times in a neat and attractive appearance.

Section 24.
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Section 25. Owner's Obligation for Maintenance. It shall be the obligation of each Owner to maintain his Lot in a neat, clean and attractive condition. In the event an Owner fails to do so, the Association shall have the right to clean up the Lot, cut weeds and do such things as it may deem necessary and appropriate. The costs incurred by the Association for such Lot maintenance shall be a Lot Assessment. If construction of a house on any Lot has not begun within three (3) years after conveyance of that Lot by Developer, the Association may, but is not obligated, to install an irrigation system, plant grass and maintain the Lot to provide a finished appearance. The costs of these services shall be a Lot Assessment. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Owner who is charged the Lot Assessment ("Defaulting Owner") fails to pay the Lot Assessments, and the Association is in need of funds to pay the costs incurred, the cost of such Lot Assessment can be spread equally among all Owners. Such spreading of cost shall not in any way alleviate the Defaulting Owner's responsibility to pay the entire Lot Assessment, with interest, costs, attorneys' fees, and late fees, if applicable.

ARTICLE IX: UTILITY EASEMENTS AND OTHER EASEMENTS

Section 1. Developer's Rights with Respect to Reserved or Platted Easements. The Developer shall have the unrestricted right, without the approval or joinder of any other person or entity to designate the use and to alienate, release, or otherwise assign the easements shown in the Plat or described herein.

Section 2. Utility Easements. Developer reserves for itself and for the Association and its designees a ten foot (10') easement for the benefit of the Property, upon, across, over, through and under, along and parallel to each front and rear Lot line and a five foot (5') along and parallel to each side Lot line for ingress, egress, installation, replacement, repair and maintenance of the utility system, for drainage, for police powers and for services supplied by either Developer or Association. By virtue of this easement, it shall be expressly permissible for Developer and the Association to install and maintain facilities and equipment on the Property, to excavate for such purposes and to affix and maintain wires, circuits, pipes and conduits on and under the Lots, following which Developer or the Association, as applicable, shall restore the affected property to its original condition as nearly as practicable. This easement shall be in addition to, rather than in place of, any other recorded easements on the Property.

Section 3. Drainage of Easement. Developer reserves for itself and for the Association and its designees a blanket easement and right on, over and under the ground within the Property to maintain and correct drainage of surface water and other erosion controls in order to maintain reasonable drainage within the Property. Said right expressly includes the right to cut any trees, bushes or shrubbery, make any grading of soil, take up pavement or to take any other similar action reasonably necessary, following which Developer or the Association, as applicable, shall restore the affected property to its original condition as nearly as practicable. Developer, or the Association, shall give reasonable notice of intent to take such action to all affected Owners, unless in the opinion of the Developer, or the Association, an emergency exists which precludes such notice. The right granted here under may be exercised at the sole option of Developer, or the Association, and shall not be construed to obligate Developer, or the Association to take any affirmative action in connection therewith.

Section 4. Easement for Encroachment. To the extent that any improvements constructed by Developer on, or if any Lot encroaches on, any other Lot or Common Area, whether by reason of any deviation from the Plat or by reason of the settling or shifting of any land or improvements, a valid easement for such encroachment and the maintenance thereof shall exist. Upon the termination of such an encroachment, the easement created in this Section 4 shall also terminate.

Section 5. Cable Television or Radio. The Developer reserves for itself, its successors and assigns, an exclusive easement for the installation, maintenance and supply for radio and television cables within rights of way and easement areas on the Plat. The Association may enter into a "bulk rate contract" for cable television and if the Association elects to enter into such contract, cable television service shall be supplied to each Lot and each Owner shall be required to pay all costs in connection therewith.

ARTICLE X: GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. Term. The covenants and restrictions contained in this Declaration, as the same may be amended from time to time, shall run with and bind the Property and shall inure to the benefit of and be enforceable by the Developer, the Association, the Owners and their respective legal representatives, heirs, successors or assigns, for a term of thirty (30) years after the date that this Declaration is recorded in the Public Records of Duval County, Florida, after which time this Declaration shall be extended automatically for successive periods of ten (10) years each unless an instrument signed by the President and Secretary of the Association certifying that the Owners of seventy five (75%) percent of the Lots subject to this Declaration have agreed to terminate all of the said provisions as of a specified date shall have been recorded. Unless this Declaration is terminated in accordance with this section, the Association shall rerecord this Declaration or other notice of its terms at intervals necessary under Florida law to preserve its effect.

Section 2. Condemnation. In the event all or part of the Common Area owned by the Association shall be taken or condemned by any authority having the power of eminent domain, all compensation and damages shall be paid to the Association. The Board of Directors of the Association shall have the sole and exclusive right to act on behalf of the Association with respect to the negotiation and litigation of the taking or condemnation affecting such property.

Section 3. Notice. Any notice required to be sent to the Owner of any Lot under the provisions of this Declaration shall be deemed to have been properly sent when mailed, first class postage prepaid, or hand delivered to the last known address of the person who appears as Owner of such Lot on the records of the Association at the time of such mailing.

Section 4. Enforcement.

a. Developer reserves the right on behalf of itself and the Association, but shall have no obligation, following ten (10) days written notice to the Owner of the Lot specifying the violation to enter upon any Lot to correct any violation of the this Declaration or to take such action, as Developer deems necessary to enforce terms and conditions of this Declaration at the expense of the Lot Owner. The Owner of the Lot shall pay Developer or Association, on demand, the actual cost of such enforcement plus twenty percent (20%) of the cost of enforcement for performing the enforcement. In the event that such Charges are not paid on demand the Charges shall bear interest at the maximum legal rate of interest from the date of demand. Developer or Association may, in its option, bring action of law against the Lot Owner personally obligated to pay the same, or upon giving the Lot Owner ten (10) days written notice of intention to me a claim of lien against a Lot, may file and foreclose such lien in the same manner as is set forth in Article VI which lien shall be subordinate to the lien of a mortgagee as set forth in Section 6(d) of Article VI. Fines are excluded from liens. In addition, Developer shall be entitled to bring actions at law for damages or in equity for injunctions for the purposes of curing or correcting any violation of the terms of these covenants and restrictions of this Declaration. All costs and expenses, including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees (at trial, in settlement, on appeal and in bankruptcy) incurred by Developer or the Association to effectuate collection of any Charges or to cure or correct any violation of the terms of this Declaration shall be borne by the Lot Owners responsible for the Charges or violations in question. All foregoing remedies of Developer or the Association shall be cumulative to any and all other remedies of Developer provided herein or at law or in equity. The failure by Developer or Association to bring any action to enforce any provisions of this Declaration shall in no event be deemed a waiver of the right to do so thereafter as to the same breach or as to one occurring

prior to or subsequent thereto, nor shall such failure give rise to any claim or cause of action by any Lot Owner or any other party against Developer or the Association.

b. In addition to the enforcement provisions previously set forth in this Declaration, the provisions of this Declaration may be enforced by any Owner (including the Developer) or the Association by a proceeding at law or in equity against any person or entity violating or attempting to violate the same, either to restrain violation or to recover damages, or both, and against his or its property to enforce any lien created by this Declaration. Failure to so enforce any of the covenants and restrictions of this Declaration shall in no event be deemed a waiver of the right to do so at any time thereafter. Furthermore, the St. Johns River Water Management District shall have the right to enforce, by a proceeding at law or in equity, the provisions contained in this Declaration which relate to the maintenance, operation and repair of the surface water management system.

Section 5. Approval Procedure. Whenever the approval of the Developer or Association is required by this Declaration, no action requiring such approval shall be commenced or undertaken until after a request shall be sent to Developer by Registered or Certified Mail with return receipt requested. When the Developer fails to act on any such written request within thirty (30) days after the date of receipt by the Developer, the approval of the Developer to the particular action sought shall be granted; however, no action shall be taken by or on behalf of the person or persons submitting the written request which violates any of these covenants and restrictions of this Declaration.

Section 6. Amendment.

a. Developer specifically reserves the absolute and unconditional right, so long as it owns any of the Property, to amend this Declaration without the consent or joinder of any party to (i) conform to the requirements of the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation, Federal National Mortgage Association, FRAN AIHUD or any other generally recognized institution involved in the purchase and sale of home loan mortgages or (ii) to conform to the requirements of institutional mortgage lender(s) or title insurance company(ies) or (iii) to conform to the requirements of any governmental or quasi governmental agency granting permits or approvals for the development of the Property, or (iv) to perfect, clarify or make internally consistent the provisions herein.

b. Developer reserves the right to amend this Declaration in any other manner without the joinder of any party until the termination of Class B membership so long as (i) the voting power of existing Members is not diluted thereby, (ii) the Assessments of existing Owners are not increased except as may be expressly provided for herein, and (iii) no Owner's right to the use and enjoyment of his Lot is materially and adversely altered thereby, unless such Owner has consented thereto.

c. Upon termination of the Class B Membership, this Declaration may be amended at a duly called meeting of the Association where a quorum is present, if the amendment resolution is adopted by two thirds (2/3rds) of the votes of all Class A Members of the Association present at such meeting. An amendment so adopted shall be effective upon the recordation in the public records of Duval County of a copy of the amendment resolution, signed by the President of the Association and certified by the Secretary of the Association.

d. Any amendment to this Declaration which would affect the Surface Water Management System including the water management portions of the Common Areas must have the prior approval of the St. Johns River Water Management District.

e. Notwithstanding the foregoing so long as there is a Class B Membership, the following actions shall require the approval of the FHA or VA: annexation of additional properties, dedication of a Common Area, amendment of this Declaration or the Association Articles.

Section 7. Attorney's Fees. Any and all legal fees, including but not limited to attorneys' fees and court costs, including any appeals and bankruptcy, which may be incurred by the Developer or Association in the lawful enforcement of any of the provisions of this Declaration, regardless of whether such enforcement requires judicial action, shall be assessed against and collectible from the unsuccessful party to the action, and if an Owner, shall be a lien against such Owner's Lot in favor of the Association and/or Developer.

Section 8. Assignment of Developer's Rights. The Developer shall have the sole and exclusive right at any time, and from time to time, to transfer and assign to, or to withdraw from, such person, firm, corporation or it shall elect, any or all rights, powers, privileges, authorities and reservations given to or reserved by the Developer by any part or paragraph of this Declaration. The Developer may assign only a portion of its rights hereunder, or all or a portion of such rights in connection with appropriate portion of the Property. In the event of such partial assignment, the assignee shall not be deemed the Developer but may exercise such rights of Developer specifically assigns to it. Any such assignment may be made in a nonexclusive basis. Reference in the Declaration to Dawson Development Company, Inc. as the Developer is not intended and shall not be construed to impose on Dawson Development Company, Inc., any obligations, legal or otherwise, for acts and omissions of third parties who purchase lots within the property from Developer and improve and resell the same. Following any such assignment, Developer shall be relieved of the performance of all duties and obligations hereunder. If at any time hereafter there shall be no person, firm or corporation entitled to exercise the rights, powers, privileges, authorities, and reservations given to or reserved by the Developer under these provisions, the same shall be vested in and be exercised by the Association. Nothing herein contained, however, shall be construed as conferring any rights, powers, privileges, authorities or reservations in said committee except in the event aforesaid.

Section 9. Release of Restrictions. In each instance where a structure has been erected or construction has substantially advanced in such a manner that some portion of the structure encroaches on any Lot line, set back line, or easement area, the Developer reserves for itself the right to release the Lot from the encroachment and to grant an exception to permit the encroachment by the structure over the Lot line, set back line or easement area. Without the consent and joinder of any person, irrespective of who owns the burdened Lot or easement areas so long as the Developer in the exercise of its sole discretion, determines the release or exception will not materially or adversely effect the value of the adjacent Lot or overall appearance of the Property.

Section 10. Miscellaneous Provisions.

- a. This Declaration shall be construed in accordance with laws of the State of Florida.
- b. The provisions of this Declaration shall be liberally construed to effectuate their purpose of creating a uniform consistent plan for the development and use of the Property.
- c. The invalidity of any part of this Declaration shall not impair or affect in any manner the validity and enforceability of the balance of the Declaration which shall remain in full force and effect.
- d. The use of the masculine gender herein shall be deemed to include the feminine gender and the use of the singular shall be deemed to include the plural, whenever the context so requires.
